Outreach in April

"Blankets of Hope" Collection

The Women's Ministry will begin collecting monetary donations for "Blankets of Hope" (BOH) beginning in April. BOH is a nonprofit corporation which provides twin bed mattresses, blankets, sheets and pillows to MANY people and organizations throughout Berks County.

Since December 2011, BOH has donated 64,000+ brand new fleece blankets to well over 100 organizations. The goal of BOH is to make sure every adult, and especially every child, is not sleeping on the floor. Every penny donated is used to purchase bedding for those in need. Please keep this fundraiser in mind as you look towards April.

Hope Rescue Mission & Lighthouse Clothing Drive

Throughout the month of April, we will be hosting a clothing drive to benefit Hope Rescue Mission Men's Center and LightHouse, which is their recently completed women & children's center. As a reminder of how mighty of an impact a small congregation such as Saint Peter's can make, last August we hosted our first clothing drive for Hope Rescue Mission and collected and donated nearly 40 bags of items!

Needless to say, they were so grateful to hear that we would host another drive for them this spring. HRM will accept new or *gently used* clothing for men, women, and children, for any season.

Hope Rescue Mission and LightHouse Clothing Collection

We'll be collecting all seasons of clothing for men, women and children. Coats, hats, scarves, gloves, shoes, towels, belts, purses, and new underwear in sizes small to xxxl. Clothing is preferred to be placed in clean plastic bags and does not need to be sorted other than to *keep "new in package" items separate from used items*. Look for a box or bin in the Welcome Center where you may drop off donations. A pickup date will be scheduled for some time in mid-May.
